JSNA project: Emotional health and wellbeing – Children & young people

What it is

- Collation of information about:
- Children & young people (CYP) from birth, across key transitional development stages up to adulthood; 0-25 years
- Their emotional, mental health & wellbeing
- Recommendations for the future
- Awaiting final sign off before publication to JSNA website

What it adds

- Services working with CYP to take an ACE and trauma-informed approach
- mental health and wellbeing at the heart of all strategy and policy



Drug and alcohol recommissioning

What it is

- Work will shortly start on retender preparatory work
- Intelligence work to be run as a JSNA project as it will need to be a multiagency piece of work

What it adds

- Informs recommissioning of drug & alcohol services



JSNA project: Adult population Mental Wellbeing & Suicide Prevention

What it is

- At early stage agreeing scope
- Big Bolton's Wellbeing conversation will form part of this – analysis complete pending final sign off before publication on JSNA website
- 2020 Suicide audit complete

What it adds

- Owned by Population Mental Wellbeing & Suicide Prevention Steering Group, will inform workstreams under this group



JSNA project: Aging well

What it is

- Project group has been formed and met
- Agreed to use WHO age friendly cities framework
- Focus on healthy place; recovery & reconditioning; dementia & falls
- To include evidence review & summary & gap identification

What it adds

- Led by Older People's Partnership board – established, influential group who will be able to implement recommendations widely
- Built from questions services are asking & opportunities to inform action
- Gaps identified can be used to service workplans to help fill them

Neighbourhoods work

What it is

- Further updates to resident-based online neighbourhood information tool, to compare with other areas nationally
- New GP practice-based neighbourhood profiles now held on the JSNA website
- Information relating to both healthcare & determinants of health

What it adds

- Provides one stop shop for data & evidence develop particularly to inform emerging Integrated Care Partnership priorities
- Promotes JSNA to healthcare focussed users

Equalities

What it is

- New equalities JSNA website section linked with new council equalities strategy
- Overview of borough level data & links to more detailed info
- Links to harmonised 'best practice' questions to capture equalities information from service users/residents

What it adds

- Accessible, reliable source of data relating to equalities characteristics in the Bolton population
- Making completion of EIAs easier & more consistent
- Making capture of equalities info more consistent
- Raising awareness of the JSNA among a non health-focussed user group



Updated neighbourhoods & Primary Care networks map

What it is

- Updated interactive map of commonly used geographies
- Now including primary care networks (GP practices, linked to neighbourhood working)

What it adds

- Produced by CCG – strengthening links working on the JSNA
- Reliable, accessible single source of information



Hospital catchments – data update

What it is

- Signposting to updated hospital catchments from NHS Digital
- www.boltonjsna.org.uk/ill-health

What it adds

- Hospital catchments now include dominant provider
- Elective catchment is tightly matched to the borough, while emergency a little wider
- Letting us better compare hospital activity with the wider population it serves

Open data Bolton

What it is

- Open data is data that can be freely used, re-used and redistributed
- www.bolton.gov.uk/opendata
- Open data hackathon with Bolton Uni - climate emergency – public health aspects

What it adds

- Open data supports our agendas around accountability, honesty & respect, working together
- Links with JSNA – many JSNA intelligence products are built off open data
- JSNA project process - consideration if new datasets found or generated can be released as open data
