




Caveat

White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller were nearly twice as likely to be in bad or very bad health compared to the total population of Greater Manchester. White: Roma rate better than average.




White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller had higher proportions for bad or very bad health for each of the broad age bands in GM with the gap generally widening with age.

 Manchester. Further age breakdown is possible. Similar chart for Roma population also possible if required.



White: Roma (8.9%) had the lowest percentage disabled or long-term health problem whereas White Gypsy or Irish Traveller (26.3%) had a percentage above the average across GM.



Note even the wider definition does not meet the social model of disability. If disability is defined too narrowly it may impact on how resources are invested by local authorities in services delivered to disabled people.

Nearly half of White: Gypsy or Irish Travellers unpaid carers in Greater Manchester were providing 50 or more hours unpaid care per week. Roma carers also had a higher proportion for 50+ hours of unpaid care.

Locally (and nationally) the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller community has the highest proportion for households deprived in the health and disability domain. The proportion for White: Roma was relatively low due to the age profile.





HEADLINE POPULATION DATA ON THE GYPSY, ROMA AND TRAVELLER COMMUNITIES

Roma (0.1%) and Gypsy or Irish Traveller (0.1%) were the two smallest ethnic groups in GM in 2021.









White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller, or other Traveller plus Other Gypsy/Romany population across Greater Manchester, 2021 Census





Nationally, White: Gypsy, Irish Travellers and Roma have a relatively low average age compared to some other ethnic groups and the overall average, but (as shown on the next slide) their age profiles are very different.



The White: Roma population is much younger than the general population in GM. 90% of White: Roma were under 50 years of age in GM compared to 66% for the GM population as a whole.




■ White: Roma population in GM


The White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller population has an unusually high proportion in the younger age bands but low proportion in the oldest age band.


Partly due to the younger age profile, the White: Roma population were majority male in contrast to the general population in GM where there were more females than males.

In contrast to the White: Roma population, the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller population were majority female and with a higher proportion of females than the general population.

Key takeaways (population)

- 1 There were just under 6,000 GM residents from the GRT community recorded in the 2021 Census.
- The different age profiles of the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller and White: Roma account for some of their differences in the statistics on health and disability. Age-standardised percentages were not available.
- The Traveller community in particular are likely to have been harder to enumerate in the 2021 Census than other groups, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. So, there is probably an undercount in this group.






Percentage in bad or very bad health, 2021 Census

Key takeaways (General health)

- Nationally and locally the percentage in bad or very bad health is highest amongst the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller population.
- As health gets worse in the older age groups, the percentage gap between the Gypsy/Irish Traveller population and the total population in bad or very bad health widens as age increases.
- The White: Roma population had lower percentages for those in bad or very bad health compared to the total population, but they do have a younger age profile. (The data is not age standardised.)






Percentage disabled by ethnic group in Greater Manchester, 2021 Census

White: Roma (8.8%) had the lowest proportion of disabled or long-term health problem whereas White Gypsy or Irish Traveller (30.3%) had the highest proportion in England and Wales.






Across Greater Manchester 41.3% of Household Reference Persons from the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller community had a disability.





The Household Reference Person (HRP) is the person responsible for filling in the Census form often the head of household and the main (or only) income earner.

- Not disabled under the Equality Act: Has long-term physical or mental health condition but day-to-day activities are not limited

Key takeaways (Disability)

- There is a marked contrast in disability percentages between White: Roma (8.9%) and White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller (26.3%) in GM. The different age profiles are a factor in this difference.
- White: Roma had the lowest percentage of disability in GM and across England & Wales in 2021.
- In contrast White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller had a high percentage in GM (26.3%) and the highest percentage in England & Wales (30.3%). This despite the relatively young age structure (average 31.2 years in E&W) compared to the whole population (41.2 years in E&W).

Proportions locally and nationally who are providing unpaid care by ethnic group were quite similar. However, there is a big difference between the ethnic groups. Age profile can explain some of the differences but the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller rates are particularly high.





Key takeaways (Unpaid carers)

- The White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller community had high proportions providing unpaid care due to the high rates of disability and poor health amongst family members (rather than due to old age of family members).
- For carers in both the Roma and Gypsy/Irish Traveller communities the amount of care is substantial and therefore probably likely to limit employment options and impact on income and benefit dependency.
- Increasing awareness of available benefits such as Carers Allowance, Attendance Allowance and Pension Credit may help some of the carers and those they care for if they are not presently claiming but could claim.

4 Households deprived in the health and disability dimension

Deprived households in the health and disability domain

Both locally and nationally the White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller community had the highest proportions of household deprivation in the health and disability domain of deprivation.

(Note: Results are not age-standardised. The White: Roma low percentage most likely to be due to the unusual age profile.)


- Approximately half of White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller households were classed as deprived in the health and disability domain in the 2021 Census. The proportion was much higher than for any other ethnic group. White: Roma rates were lower due to the high proportion of young adults in that community.
- As with many of the statistics shown the percentages for Greater Manchester follow a similar pattern to that found at the national level of the GRT groups.
- Other measures of deprivation are also available to analyse: education, employment and housing domains of deprivation and these can be combined to look at multiple deprivation.

Key takeaways (Accommodation type)

- 1 13.9% of the 2,259 GM residents living in a caravan/mobile structure are White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller a far higher proportion than any other ethnic group.

 There are more White: Roma residents in GM living in a flat or apartment (1,127) than Roma living in any other accommodation type.
- There were relatively low percentages of White: Roma and White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller living in semi-detached properties.
- White: Roma and White: Gypsy or Irish Traveller have higher rates of occupation of smaller properties (flats and caravans) and they have high rates of overcrowding. 30.4% of Roma residents are in overcrowded accommodation and for Gypsy or Irish Traveller the rate is 34.1% across GM.

Household definition in the Census

Household

A household is defined as:

- one person living alone, or
- a group of people (not necessarily related) living at the same address who share cooking facilities and share a living room or sitting room, or dining area

This includes:

- all sheltered accommodation units in an establishment (irrespective of whether there are other communal facilities), and
- all people living in caravans on any type of site that is their usual residence; this will include anyone who has no other usual residence elsewhere in the UK

A household must contain at least one person whose place of usual residence is at the address. A group of short-term residents living together is not classified as a household, and neither is a group of people at an address where only visitors are staying.
